BUSINESS OVERVIEW

Just for Asia (JFA) was organized in the state of Tennessee on June 1, 2007, specifically as a charitable corporation. It was established to partner with people, organizations and communities in initiatives that will impact children and families in poverty through establishing orphanages and medical clinics, clean water projects, micro financing, agricultural development and other humanitarian projects in Asia.

The founders of Just for Asia, Michael and Beverly Gillam, have been involved with humanitarian projects in Asia since 1999, partnering with local non-governmental organizations (NGO) and other organizations of the highest integrity, funding specific projects.

JFA CAMBODIA CONNECTION

For the past several years, we have had a relationship with a Christian pastor named Sinai Phoeuk in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. Pastor Sinai and his wife, Somalay, pastor a church in Phnom Penh (Fellowship Word of Life Church) and started and run seven orphanages in various locations in Cambodia.

Their organization is called New Hope for Orphans (<http://www.nho.org.kh>). Their website is quite informative and tells quite a good story about Cambodia, the dark years of the Khmer Rouge regime (1975-1979) and the incredible story of Pastor Sinai and his vision for the people of Cambodia.

Pastor Sinai and his organization have also started forty satellite churches and have a heart and vision to continue to plant churches throughout Cambodia. Pastor Sinai acts as the Senior Pastor to these churches and pours his life into training these young pastors and growing these churches into what God would have them to be.

At the present time, JFA has worked exclusively in Cambodia since we believe we have a heavenly mandate to establish three (3) medical clinics in very specific areas, and will continue to push the development of the remaining two (2) clinics as He provides the funds and takes care of the details. As He leads and we have additional funds for ministry in other areas, we expect the activities of JFA will expand into other south Asian countries.

OUR FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN

Fundraising is the life blood of any nonprofit organization. The founders of JFA had five years of fundraising experience buying and reselling popular items purchased in Asia. Therefore, the core of our fundraising campaign is to raise money through product sales.

We were fortunate in January 2009 to have the fundraising support of Dr. Tonya Brown of the American Health Network (d.b.a. Kokomo Family Care) in Kokomo, IN. Dr. Brown made a presentation on the ministry, activities and needs of JFA, and raised the awareness of JFA in Kokomo. We are so grateful for this fundraising support, and for our new donors.

2009 HIGHLIGHTS

SEN SOK MEDICAL CLINIC

The work at our initial clinic continues, and has served 7,965 people from its inception to the end of the Year 2009. In 2009, we averaged over 450 people per month, and provided free medical care to them at a cost of about \$2.50 per person. This free medical care is combined with a pastor who follows up with the villagers, meeting spiritual needs after their physical needs have been attended to. As a result, there have been many positive decisions to follow the Lord in Sen Sok, and the church there is growing. (Our



partner organization, New Hope for Orphans, is increasing its commitment to the area, and the pastor there will soon become a full-time presence in the village.)

CHEK SVAY COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAM

In February 2009, JFA started an outreach to the small village of Chek Svay. This is another village of people dispossessed from the Phnom Penh garbage dump, and the land they were given to resettle is essentially a drainage canal and without access to clean water, far from Phnom Penh and close to Sen Sok. JFA pays the salaries of two women who work with the community, meeting needs and ministering in the name of Jesus to the people there. Part of the work there includes a simple lunch program for the little ones, playing games and some classroom activity such as a reading program. As JFA has further opportunity, we would expect this ministry to expand.



MEDICAL CLINIC OUTREACH TO THE VILLAGE OF PREY VENG

On 1 December 2009, Just for Asia's medical clinic staff in Sen Sok, Cambodia partnered with a missions team from the Island Evangelical Christian Community (Island ECC) Church in Hong Kong to hold a "mobile medical clinic" in a small village south of Phnom Penh.

It was the first time JFA's medical team had been mobilized for such a trip (requiring a 3-hour drive south from Phnom Penh). We recorded each patient's health complaints and noted the length of time they had suffered from the ailment. Some had suffered 2 or more years, and the ailments were, in many cases, healed with a simple pill. Many of these treatments would be so easy and affordable to people living in developed countries, but to these poor villagers who were treated that day, these treatments are simply not available.





We provided free medical treatment to 120 patients for the day. We are thankful to God for the opportunity to help - in the form of medicine and treatment for their physical healing and the message of HOPE for their spiritual healing.

This outreach was a complete success also from a logistics standpoint and it will be easy to duplicate in the future. It was also wonderful to see how Island ECC's team integrated well to help the Sen Sok Clinic medical team and gratifying to see how the medical outreach added to Island ECC's effectiveness in ministering in the name of Christ.

ONGOING PROJECT LIST
